Census 2020: Shape your Future

Every 10 years the United States administers a Census to count every person living in the 50 states, District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories. The Census is important as it helps to determine how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding will flow into communities every year for the next decade. An accurate count of Lincolnwood will help to ensure that the Village receives proper assistance for federal resources. To help answer some common questions about the Census, the Village has put together the frequently asked questions below:

When do I need to respond?

By April 1, 2020 every home will receive an invitation to participate in the Census and you will be able to respond online, by phone or by mail. The Census document will include instructions on how you can respond to the questions.

I do not have a computer, but I want to fill it out electronically. What can I do?

The Lincolnwood Library, located at 4000 W. Pratt Avenue, has space dedicated for the 2020 Census, which includes a computer and informational fliers to assist residents.

Is the information confidential?

The U.S. Census Bureau is bound by law to protect your

answers and to keep them strictly confidential. Every employee takes an oath to protect your personal information for life.

Does the Census ask for personal information?

The Census does collect information about you and who lives in your home, which is protected by law, but will never ask for your social security number, money or donations, questions on behalf of a political party or about your banking / credit card information. If you receive any questions about this type of information contact the U.S. Census Bureau using the information below as soon as possible.

Bus Routes Updates

Since 2016, the Village of Lincolnwood has been working with Pace, the Chicago Transit Authority (CTA), the



Regional Transportation Authority (RTA), and neighboring communities to provide guidance on mass transportation improvements for the region. This process included several public meetings and feedback from communities. As a result of this process, Pace is making revisions to its routes in Lincolnwood to realign resources within the region. The most significant changes that would affect Lincolnwood include:

- Modification of Pace Route 215 (Crawford Avenue), which currently runs from Old Orchard Mall to the Howard CTA stop, will now connect Old Orchard Mall to the Jefferson Park CTA / Metra stop via Crawford Avenue which connects Lincolnwood to the Blue Line.
- Discontinuation of Route 210 (Lincoln Avenue) which is a lightly used route in the community.

Public Hearings were held during the months of January and February to solicit feedback from communities and patrons of mass transportation on these proposed changes.

Citizen's Police Academy

Beginning April 1, 2020 the next session of the Citizen's Police Academy (CPA) will start and will run for eight weeks with an anticipated graduation date of May 27, 2020. Residents and business operators within the Village are invited to attend this program to learn more about policing in Lincolnwood and how community involvement makes for a safer community. Classes will be every Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. in the Police/Fire Training Room located at 6900 N. Lincoln Avenue. Public Works Reminders

Rebate Programs

If your home experiences backups on your private, sanitary sewer line and repair or replacement of the line is necessary, you may qualify for the Village's Sewer Line Repair Rebate Program. For collapses determined to be within the Village right-of-way and that are directly caused by a tree root from a Village tree, the repair or replacement may be eligible for rebate of up to \$2,000. If the collapse is outside of the Village right-of-way, the repair cost is the responsibility of the property owner. In order to confirm the cause of the collapse is tree roots, the property owner will need to provide a copy of a sewer televising video taken by a private plumber.

The Village also offers a Flood Control Rebate Program, to help residents make improvements to protect their property from basement backups during major storm water events through the installation of overhead sewers and/or backflow check valves. This program offers a 50/50 match of the total project cost up to a maximum of \$2,000.

For those properties that experience rear yard flooding, the Village will begin offering a rebate program to assist homeowners with improvements starting on May 1, 2020. More information about this new program will be made available in late spring on the Village's website and in future editions of this newsletter.

Animal Control Program

The Village has an animal control cost sharing reimbursement program for opossums, raccoons, and skunks. If you are encountering problems with any of these animals, please contact the Public Works Department at (847) 675-0888. The Village will process a reimbursement of 50% of the cost, up to \$200 for qualifying events.

Street Sweeping Reminder

Street sweeping is performed annually throughout the Village to keep streets clean as well as to prevent dirt and debris from entering the Village's sewer system. Permanent signs are installed on each block notifying residents when street sweeping will occur in the area. Street sweeping is a two day process. Motorists should not park on the side of the street where street sweeping will occur that day. To receive a street sweeping reminder, please contact Public Works at (847) 675-0888 to add your name to a call-out list.

Residents will have street sweeping performed every month on the same day of the week and will begin on April 7.

Spring Tree Planting

The Village undertakes a fall and spring tree planting program with the goal of replacing trees that have been removed, and filling in open spaces along the parkway. This year's spring planting is scheduled to take place in April. Capital Projects Summary


Annually, the Village constructs improvements meant to enhance the Village. In Fiscal Year 2020 ending April 30, 2020, the Village completed the following projects:

Roadway Resurfacing – The Village repaved Longmeadow Avenue from Sauganash to Pratt Avenues and also paved portions of Lawndale, Lunt, Ridgeway, Morse, and Central Park Avenues. The project marks completion of year 1 of the 10-Year Resurfacing Program.

Standpipe Painting – The interior and exterior of the Standpipe were repaired and repainted, ensuring the continued operation of this important piece of infrastructure for years to come.

Devon Avenue Streetlights – New LED streetlights were installed along Devon Avenue from Longmeadow to Lincoln Avenues. Street lights along Cicero Avenue and McCormick Boulevard were also retrofitted with LED fixtures which provide greater light with less energy consumption.

Public Works Roof – The Public Works Department's roof was replaced to ensure the building can continue to serve the public for years to come.



Water Transmission Main – Construction of the water transmission main began in the fall of 2019. The project will continue into Fiscal Year 2021 due to its significant size and scope. The water transmission main will connect the Village's potable water system with the City of Evanston's water system. The savings recognized from purchasing water from Evanston will be utilized to fund this project and future water main replacements to update the Village's aging water system. Certain smaller distribution mains along the transmission main path have been replaced as part of this project. Completion of this project is anticipated to occur in summer 2020.

North Shore Outfall Sewer – Installation of a 60-inch stormwater outfall sewer is under construction on North Shore Avenue from Drake Avenue to the North Shore Channel to help mitigate stormwater issues in the area. The Village received a \$1.4 million grant from the MWRD for construction of this project. The North Shore Outfall Sewer project is a recommended improvement in the Village's Stormwater Master Plan and gets the Village one step closer to realizing the stated goal of providing protection from basement backups during a 10-year storm event. The project will also continue into Fiscal Year 2021.

Business Spotlight

Sheri Doniger, long-time Lincolnwood resident and Dentist, has maintained her dental practice in Lincolnwood for approximately 32 years, in the Republic Bank Building at 4433 W. Touhy Avenue. Sheri knew early on, after working as an associate in several dental practices in the area following dental school, that Lincolnwood was the best place for her and her family and a great opportunity to grow her business. Sheri is proud of her business in Lincolnwood and the Village is proud to have her serving on the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners. We asked Sheri a few questions about her experience in the community, and gave her the opportunity to wax poetic about her love for Lincolnwood:



Why did you decide to open and grow your business in Lincolnwood?

While attending dental school, I knew I wanted to own my own business. After graduating in 1983, I worked as an associate in several dental practices in the area. During that time, I had the opportunity to work with several excellent clinicians who showed me what a great dental practice should look like. In 1988, I began the search for a space to design my own dental practice. After an extensive search, I selected the Bank of Lincolnwood building (now the Republic Bank Building) in the center of town. I had very few specific parameters for the practice: I wanted to practice in Lincolnwood and I had to be within five minutes of the schools where my children were and would be attending in case there was an emergency and they needed me for any reason.

What have you found in Lincolnwood that surprises you?

I have been a resident of Lincolnwood for 35 years. I love the diversity of Lincolnwood and the amazing way everyone gets along.

What community role do you believe local business owners should play?

Local business owners should always advocate for the town they work in. There is a reason why a business owner selects a particular

town or neighborhood, be it close to the highway, the diversity, the accessibility of public transportation or the parks to take leisurely walks. Lincolnwood has this and much more.

What is the greatest challenge you have faced in growing a successful business?

Dental practices grow in two ways: by local patients seeking care and word of mouth from current patients. With the opening of many corporate dental groups who have large advertising dollars, the former patients tend to gravitate to

what they perceive as “faster, quicker, cheaper” dental care, without thinking about the need for a personal connection to their health care provider.

What has been the proudest moment of your career?

I have had an amazing career. Dentistry has taken me in a variety of different directions, including being a clinician, international speaker, consultant and author. The proudest moment was truly when I graduated dental school. I was married a week before dental school started, had my daughter between first and second year, and was pregnant with my son at graduation. My parents were so proud of their daughter, the Doctor. I was proud I achieved my goals of becoming a professional and starting my own business.

How would you describe your experience as a business owner in Lincolnwood?

I am proud of the fact that we are a women-owned business that has been in Lincolnwood for thirty two years and counting. I believe being a woman practitioner offers a unique insight to oral healthcare, as the woman is usually the decision maker when it comes to healthcare. We understand the needs of our patients, take time to communicate and listen to them, and work with those who may be a little jittery about seeing the dentist in the first place. Lincolnwood is the place not only where I have a business, but where I raised my family. I believe my practice's longevity is a good indicator that I have had an awesome experience as a business owner in Lincolnwood.

New Chamber Executive Director

This past January, the Lincolnwood Chamber of Commerce welcomed Erin Lyons into the top leadership position in this organization dedicated to improving the economic, civic and cultural climate of Lincolnwood. Development Updates

District 1860

Northwest Corner of Lincoln & Touhy Avenues

Final Zoning Approvals were granted for the District 1860 project over the past three months. The six-story mixed-use building (commercial first floor and apartments above) and one-story commercial building fronting on Touhy Avenue were approved in Phase I of the Final Planned Unit Development (PUD) in November, 2019.

This was followed by the recent approval of Phase II of the PUD, which includes the dual-branded Marriott (Residence Inn and Spring Hill Suites) Hotel, setting the stage for Building Permit review and approvals this spring. Tucker Development expects to begin demolition of the existing Purple Hotel building foundations in the next few months, with construction beginning in earnest shortly thereafter, and completion expected in the fall of 2021. It was also recently announced that Fat Rosie's Taco and Tequila Bar and Fatpour Tap Works would be joining the development.

Radler Plaza

4320 W. Touhy Avenue

Construction is now complete at the new Radler Plaza, a multi-tenant commercial shopping center on the north side of Touhy Avenue, between Lowell and Kildare Avenues. Starbucks coffee shop and drive-thru opened last November and leaves two

available tenant spaces in the center. It is anticipated the center will be fully-leased by the summer.

6900 McCormick Boulevard & 7373 Cicero Avenue

Demolition of the former Publications International Limited office/warehouse building at 7373 N. Cicero Avenue has been completed and construction of the new Zeigler Cadillac dealership is well underway. This new, state-of-the-art facility will house the existing Cadillac dealership, which will be relocated from the Autoplex on McCormick Boulevard. Construction will continue throughout the spring and into the summer, with an opening for the new dealership expected late this summer. Once Cadillac has relocated to Cicero Avenue, Buick and GMC will expand in the existing Autoplex, which has recently completed a renovation project, in anticipation of this relocation.



That building will be utilized to store additional vehicles for sale, as Loeber has been granted additional inventory by Porsche's North American headquarters in Atlanta. Construction is expected to be completed, and the remodeled dealership opened this summer.
