Road closures and temporary water shutdowns are unfortunate, yet required from time to time and the website is a perfect resource to find information on what is planned. Village News

On September 17, 2024, the ETC Institute presented the Village of Lincolnwood with the “Leading the Way Award” for its achievements in exceptional service delivery. ETC Institute's "Leading the Way Award" recognizes local governments for outstanding achievement in the delivery of services to residents. Recipients of the award rank in the top 10% of all local governments in the United States with regard to their composite performance in the three core areas that are assessed on ETC Institute's DirectionFinder® Survey:

- satisfaction with the overall quality of services
- satisfaction with customer service provided by employees, and
- satisfaction with the value residents think they receive for local taxes and fees

The ETC institute, which has administered surveys in over 1,000 cities and counties across the country, was hired to coordinate the Community Survey distributed earlier this year to assess community satisfaction and gather input from residents on the priorities of the community. A total of 93% of the residents surveyed, who had an opinion, rated the Village of Lincolnwood as an “excellent” or “good” place to live; 91% rated the Village as an “excellent” or “good” place to raise children, and 84% gave the Village ratings of “excellent” or “good” as a place to educate children. In addition, a total of 86% of the residents surveyed gave the Village ratings of “excellent” or “good” for overall quality of life, and 82% rated the Village as “excellent” or “good” for quality of services.

Environmental

Garbage, Recycling and Yard Waste

As a reminder, the Village's waste hauler, Groot, picks up refuse and recycling on Mondays. If a pickup is missed, residents must call the Public Works Department before 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday at (847) 675-0888.

Recycling Reminders

Groot collects recycling in conjunction with garbage collection on Mondays. The following items are recyclable: newspapers, magazines, paper bags, cardboard, paperboard (tissue boxes, cereal boxes, etc.), plastic food/beverage containers, milk/juice bottles, soap/detergent bottles, metal food/beverage cans, and glass food/beverage bottles.

The following items are NOT recyclable: wire hangers, lightbulbs, mirrors, window glass, ceramics, soiled cardboard or paper (such as pizza boxes, napkins, etc.), batteries, Styrofoam, wood, plastic wrap, diapers, and electronics. It is important that recyclable materials are properly sorted from non-recyclable materials to reduce the likelihood of the recyclable materials becoming contaminated and unusable.

Fall Yard Waste Reminders & Pickup Schedule

As the autumn continues, it's important for all Lincolnwood residents to adhere to the Village's yard waste disposal guidelines to ensure the community remains clean and compliant.

Yard Waste Pickup Schedule

Groot will continue to pick up yard waste through November 25, 2024. After this date, it will be the responsibility of each homeowner to properly dispose of their yard waste. Yard waste must be placed in not your regular garbage toter.

Regulations on Leaf Disposal

To maintain the cleanliness and safety of our streets, and to prevent the clogging of storm drains, the Village strictly prohibits the placement of leaf piles on the curb. If such piles are reported, homeowners may face a code enforcement violation and potential ticketing.

Proper Disposal Methods:

- Leaves: Should be collected in brown yard waste bags or yard waste designated bins.
- Sticks and Branches: Must be bundled together. Each bundle should not exceed four feet in length or be heavier than 50 pounds. No branch should be larger than four inches in diameter.

The Village appreciates your cooperation in following these guidelines, which help keep our streets clean and our storm drains clear.

Holiday Light Recycling

Beginning November 1, 2024, the Village will offer a free holiday light recycling program in conjunction with the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County and Elgin Recycling. Accepted items include: mini-lights, C7 lights, C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, and expansion cords. The Village will not accept garlands, live greens, wreaths, or other non-recyclables.

Containers will be available at Village Hall (6900 N Lincoln Ave) Monday through Friday between 9:00 am – 5:00 pm or at the Public Works Department (7001 N. Lawndale Avenue) Monday through Friday between 7:30 am and 3:30 pm. The program ends on January 31, 2024.





Lincolnwood's Snow Removal: Working Together for Safer Winter Roads

As winter approaches, so does the likelihood of snow. The Village of Lincolnwood's Public Works Department is on call and ready to combat all winter weather. You can help us keep the streets clear by taking a few simple steps:

1. **Park Smart:** Whenever possible, park your vehicle in a driveway or garage. This allows our snowplows to clear from curb to curb efficiently. Encourage your neighbors to do the same.
2. **Keep Snow Off the Streets:** When shoveling your driveway or sidewalks, avoid tossing snow back onto the streets. Snow thrown onto the roadway can freeze and create hazardous icy patches that pose risks to vehicles and pedestrians.

Snow plowing operations begin after there is an accumulation of two or more inches of snow with consistent freezing temperatures.

The Village uses a combination of rock salt and a pre-wet solution to treat the roads, adjusting the approach based on current weather conditions to maximize safety and effectiveness. **Please Note:** The Village is not responsible for snow removal on major roadways such as Touhy, Lincoln, Cicero, Devon, or Crawford Avenues, as these are maintained by state or county. Special Note for Pratt Avenue: Parking is always prohibited on Pratt Avenue when there is an accumulation of two inches or more of snow, regardless of the day.



Alternate Side Parking for Snow Events

The Village of Lincolnwood is committed to ensuring efficient snow removal to keep the Village streets safe during the winter months. To facilitate this, there is an Alternate Side Parking Program that activates when snow accumulation reaches two or more inches.

Program Guidelines:

- **Even-Numbered Days:** On even-numbered days of the month, vehicles should be parked only on the side of the street where houses have even-numbered addresses.
- **Odd-Numbered Days:** Conversely, on odd-numbered days, parking is permitted only on the side of the street with odd-numbered addresses.

Hours of Operation: This parking regulation is in effect from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, ensuring that the streets can be thoroughly plowed and treated.

Communication: Notices regarding the activation of alternate side parking will be posted on the Village's website at www.lincolnwoodil.org and residents may receive a phone call notice if you are signed up to receive the Reverse 911 alerts. Understanding your Water Bill

Five Components of a Water Bill

Capital Improvements

Each bill includes a monthly charge of \$3.42 which is allocated to fund large Capital projects, such as, water main replacements. Water bills for residential properties are issued quarterly and reflect a charge of \$10.26 for the three-month period. Water bills for commercial properties are issued monthly, therefore they reflect the monthly charge of \$3.42. Prior to January 1, 2024, this rate was \$3.33 per month.

Water Usage

The basic water user charge is calculated quarterly based on consumption. Each unit is 1,000 gallons of metered water consumption. The current base rate is \$6.34 per unit. Prior to January 1, 2024, this rate was \$6.17 per unit. This represents a 2.89% increase in basic water use charges.

Sewer Use

Sewer Use The Sewer user fee is \$1.09 per unit. Funds that are generated from the sewer user charge are utilized for maintenance of the Village's combined sewer system as well as any improvements or repairs that are needed. Prior to January 1, 2024, this rate was \$1.06 per unit.

Water Meter Fund

Residential properties are charged a water meter fee of \$4.89 quarterly. Commercial properties are charged a water meter fund fee of \$9.78 monthly.

These fees are assessed for the use of the Village's water meters. Prior to January 1, 2024, the residential rate associated with this fee was \$4.76 and the commercial rate was \$9.51.

Debt Service Fund

The Debt Service Charge is calculated quarterly at \$3.70 per unit. This charge is allocated to pay debts incurred to improve the water delivery system for projects such as new water main replacements. Prior to January 1, 2024 this rate was \$3.60 per unit.

Fire Department



WINTER SAFETY TIP / PORTABLE SPACE HEATERS

Portable electric space heaters can be a cost effective and convenient source of supplemental heat for your home in cold weather, but they also increase the risk of fire and electric shock if not used properly. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.

Heating equipment is the second leading cause of home fires in the United States. More than 65,000 home fires are attributed to heating equipment each year. These fires result in hundreds of deaths, thousands of injuries and millions of dollars in property damage. Unfortunately, space heaters can pose significant fire and electric shock hazards if not used properly. Fire and electrical hazards can be caused by space heaters without adequate safety features, space heaters placed near combustibles, or space heaters that are improperly plugged in.



Safety should always be a top consideration when using space heaters. Here are some tips for keeping your home safe and warm when it's cold outside:

- Make sure your space heater has the label showing that it is listed by a recognized testing laboratory.
- Before using any space heater, read the manufacturer's instructions and warning labels carefully.
- Inspect heaters for cracked or broken plugs or loose connections before each use. If frayed, worn or damaged, do not use the heater.
- Never leave a space heater unattended. Turn it off when you're leaving a room or going to sleep, and don't let pets or children play too close to a space heater.
- Space heaters are only meant to provide supplemental heat and should never be used to warm bedding, cook food, dry clothing or thaw pipes.
- Install smoke alarms on every floor of your home and outside all sleeping areas and test them once a month.
- Proper placement of space heaters is critical. Heaters must be kept at least three feet away from anything that can burn, including papers, clothing and rugs.
- Locate space heaters out of high traffic areas and doorways where they may pose a tripping hazard.
- Plug space heaters directly into a wall outlet. Do not use an extension cord or power strip, which could overheat and result in a fire. Do not plug any other electrical devices into the same outlet as the heater.
- Place space heaters on level, flat surfaces. Never place heaters on cabinets, tables, furniture, or carpet, which can overheat and start a fire.
- Always unplug and safely store the heater when it is not in use.

Prevent Package Theft: Tips to Keep Your Deliveries Safe

The holiday season is right around the corner and online shopping has become more common, so does the issue of package theft, often referred to as "porch piracy." Thieves take advantage of unattended packages left on doorsteps, especially during the holiday season when deliveries are frequent. Here are some simple tips to help protect your deliveries and keep your property secure:

1. **Track Your Packages:** Most delivery services provide tracking information. Sign up for email or text alerts to know when your package is arriving and make sure someone is home to receive it.
2. **Use Alternative Delivery Options:** If you won't be home, consider having packages delivered to your workplace, a trusted neighbor, or a secure location like a parcel locker.
3. **Require a Signature:** When possible, request that packages require a signature for delivery. This ensures your items won't be left unattended if no one is home.
4. **Install Security Cameras or Video Doorbells:** Visible security cameras or smart doorbells can deter thieves and help capture evidence in case of theft. Many cameras can also send notifications when motion is detected.
5. **In-Store Pickup or Lockers:** Many retailers offer secure pickup options, such as in-store collection or delivery to parcel lockers. These options can eliminate the risk of packages being left on your doorstep.
6. **Ask Neighbors for Help:** If you're expecting a delivery but won't be home, ask a trusted neighbor to hold your package until you return.

Staying alert and taking small steps can help prevent package theft. If you notice suspicious activity in your neighborhood, contact the Lincolnwood Police Department non-emergency number (847-673-2167) or call 9-1-1 in an emergency. Together, we can keep our community safe from porch pirates!

Construction Updates



District 1860

Construction began in the Fall of 2021. The Final Certificate of Occupancy was issued in November 2023 for the mixed-use building and related on and off-site improvements. Approximately 85 percent of the 299 residential units within the mixed-use building are leased. Fat Rosie's Taco and Tequila Bar, Mia Francesca, LensCrafters, and now FatPour Tap Works are open for business. Venezia Nail Spa has an open building permit to buildout its storefront within the development.

Building permits have been issued for the next phase of the development, a five-story, 152-room dual-branded Marriott Hotel. The hotel will be located on Lincoln Avenue, just north of the Village Green. The L-shaped building will feature an indoor pool, fitness center, dining area, and outdoor lounge. Construction activities have progressed with the completion of the foundation and pier system, the construction of above-ground steelwork, framing of wood panel walls above the fourth floor, and underground electrical and plumbing. The local developer, Lakhani Hospitality, plans to open the Residence Inn and SpringHill Suites hotels in 2025-2026.

Bais Chaim Dovid East (BCDE) Synagogue

Occupancy has been granted for the new Bais Chaim Dovid East (BCDE) Synagogue at 6424 N. Drake Avenue. Construction activities began in Fall 2022 for the new two-story building with a basement level. The building has a footprint of approximately 6,600 square feet and is located on a two-third of an acre site. The structure features a masonry and glass exterior façade and a standing seam roof screen.



3500 Devon

A renovation two attached commercial spaces at 3500 W. Devon Avenue has been completed. A new yoga studio, Asna Studios, will occupy the first floor and rooftop of the western portion of the building with office space occupying the eastern portion.



Assyrian Universal Alliance Foundation

Building permit plans were approved early this year to renovate building at 7301 N. Cicero Avenue. The new use is a child development center and administrative offices for the Assyrian Universal Alliance Foundation (AUAF). The plans include seven classrooms for Toddler through 6-year old's, a playground, exercise room, three conference rooms, and approximately 20 offices and open office areas. Construction is underway.
