## Water Supply Agreement

The Village Board of Trustees approved an agreement with the City of Evanston for the purchase of potable water at a special meeting of the Village Board held on July 23, 2018. For the past several years, the Village has been investigating the option of changing water suppliers from the City of Chicago due to significant rate increases. The Village currently pays a wholesale water rate of \$3.94/1000 gallons to Chicago. Under the new agreement with Evanston, the Village has locked in a wholesale rate of \$1.60/1000 gallons in 2020.

The Village has completed the route study to determine the best method of delivering water from Evanston to the Pump House located at Crawford and Schreiber Avenues. The selected route includes a path from the connection point at Evanston's southern standpipe at Oakton Avenue, westward to Hamlin Avenue, then south to the Village's Pump House. Phase II Engineering, which includes detailed design plans for the transmission main, is currently underway. The completed Phase II plans will be provided to contractors as part of the bidding and construction process. It is anticipated that the Village will be connected to and receiving water from Evanston by 2020. The wholesale rate savings will be used to fund the cost of constructing the transmission main to Evanston, as well as fund additional water infrastructure improvements, such as replacing 60 -100 year old water mains. ## Infrastructure Program



On November 30, 2017, the Village Board held a workshop to discuss various infrastructure improvements including the resurfacing of streets, paving of alleys, replacement of water mains, installation of sidewalks, and the means in which these projects could be funded. Following the meeting, the Mayor formed the Ad-Hoc Infrastructure Committee to review the proposed program scope and funding options. At the June 19, 2018 Committee of the Whole Meeting, the Village Board endorsed the Infrastructure Improvement Plan assembled by Staff, the Village's engineering firm, Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd., and the Ad-Hoc Infrastructure Committee.

The plan was assembled due to the age of the Village's infrastructure. Many of the Village-owned roadways are approaching the end of their useful life, which typically last 20 years. Additionally, many of the Village's water mains are approaching 100 years of age, with the majority of mains between 60 - 100 years old. In order to address the aging infrastructure, the plan identifies a ten year, phased approach to resurface every Village-owned street and replacement of all water mains in poor condition and 15% of the mains listed in fair condition. Construction of the roadway work is anticipated to begin in 2019 with water main replacements scheduled to start after the connection to Evanston is completed. 

## Incentivizing Development

As commercial properties throughout the Village mature over the decades, they help provide a sense of the familiar and a sense of permanency. Some businesses may come and go, but others are stalwarts that we all become used to seeing. However, many business and property owners have realized that with maturity, comes a need to refresh their building or property, if they wish to remain attractive to their customers. This can take the form of renovating a façade, adding new landscaping or even considering the financial benefits of undertaking environmentally-friendly “green” initiatives. These improvements all ultimately help the bottom line through savings on operating expenses and/or attracting new customers, by redefining their vision. The Village has consistently budgeted funds to help businesses make these minor, but impactful, improvements.

Recently, several business renovation projects, funded through the Village’s Property Enhancement Program (PEP) and Green Initiatives for Tomorrow program (GIFT) have been approved and completed. One of the most visible PEP projects is the Airoom (6825 Lincoln Ave.) company redesign of their parking lot which has removed a dangerous parking pattern that required vehicles to back out on to Lincoln Avenue, in lieu of safe protected off-street parking spaces. The Village incentivized this work by approving \$50,000 in grant funds for a project that would ultimately cost over \$150,000, the remainder of which was borne by the property owner. Brickyard Bank (6676 Lincoln Ave.) also undertook a

project approximately one year ago, to transform part of their space into new offices, opening up a blank wall that was visible from Lincoln Avenue, with new windows. The addition of landscape improvements, including trees, re-seeding the lawn, new curb along the sidewalk, and the addition of river rock has transformed what appeared to be “left-over” space to a landscaped courtyard.

Two other projects under way will help beautify the Lincolnwood Business Park. The Econocare warehouse and offices at 6900 N. Central Park Avenue are be receiving an updated façade and landscaping. Food For Thought (7001 Ridgeway Ave.) catering’s headquarters at Lunt and Ridgeway Avenues will be the recipient of a number of environmentally-friendly improvements that will help soften its appearance in an industrial park, while demonstrating their commitment to their buildings and to the Village. All of these projects required significant investment from the businesses themselves, but the Village also was able to provide the incentives necessary to take these from “drawing board” ideas to reality. A big thanks to these businesses that have chosen to reinvest in the community! The Village is always happy to support our business community and invest in our

businesses, who have helped make Lincolnwood a vibrant community that is continuously looking for the next opportunity to reinvent!

# Development Update

## Radler Plaza Multi-Tenant 4320 W. Touhy Ave.

Demolition has been completed at the site of the former Republic Bank drive-through, and construction of a new 6,430 square foot building is anticipated to be underway in August, once the Illinois Department of Transportation has approved a permit for a limited access driveway on Touhy Avenue, a stipulation the Village Board placed on the approval of this multi-tenant center. The property will also incorporate driveways on both Lowell and Kildare Avenues. This multi-tenant center will house two-three commercial tenants, in addition to a Starbucks drive-through. Occupancy of the building is anticipated by the end of the year.



## Proposed Medical Office Building 4656 W. Touhy Ave.

Review of a proposed renovation and expansion of the existing one-story building at the northeast corner of Touhy & Kilpatrick Avenues will continue at the September 5th Plan Commission meeting. Onsite Health Care previously purchased this building for a proposed medical facility. Plans originally included a full second-story expansion. However, after hearing concerns raised by residents and the Plan Commission, the owner is looking at alternatives to attempt to lessen impacts on the neighbors and reduce parking concerns.



## District 1860 (former Purple Hotel Site) 4500 W. Touhy Ave.

In July, the Plan Commission began their review of a concept plan, from Tucker Development of Chicago for a proposed new project on the site of the former Purple Hotel. The proposed development, which goes by the moniker "District 1860", will incorporate restaurants, service commercial, some retail commercial, and 300 luxury apartment units. A hotel use is also proposed on the site by Tucker Development. Arriving at the appropriate mix of commercial uses and finding the right hotel, which will add to the distinctive character and design of this development, is as important as the design of the buildings themselves. Tucker Development will take the next step in the development and design review process when they return to the Plan Commission on September 5, with refined plans and detailed renderings, as part of a Public Hearing for the purpose of reviewing a Preliminary Planned Unit Development (PUD). A PUD designation recognizes the unique nature of this development and allows the Village to look at the appropriate design, signage, parking, building height, etc. for this project, which will ultimately create its own unique environment.




Proposed rendering of District 1860


# Building Permits

## N. Gateway Subarea Planning Project

As part of this year's budget, the Village Board approved funding to develop a plan for the North Gateway Subarea, an area generally bound by the Village's municipal boundary (Jarvis Avenue) on the north, and including properties fronting on both sides of Cicero Avenue from Jarvis Avenue to Estes Avenue, Touhy Avenue from Cicero Avenue to Lincoln Avenue, and Lincoln Avenue from Touhy Avenue to Jarvis Avenue. The intent of the planning effort is to establish land use, circulation, transportation, and urban design policies in the identified planning area in order to capitalize on the unique access to this part of the Village and plan for potential spin-off development in the future from the District 1860 project (former Purple Hotel site). This will put the Village in a proactive position when approaching commercial businesses to consider developing in this area of Lincolnwood, by establishing a vision for future development. A Community Open House is expected to be scheduled this fall, in order to gain feedback regarding this area. Stay tuned to the Village website and social media for details once the meeting is scheduled.

### 1. What do you enjoy most about working with your customers?
