Snow Plowing Information

The Village of Lincolnwood is responsible for 75 lane miles of roads to plow during inclement weather. To efficiently manage this operation, the snow removal plan divides the community into ten plow routes. The goal of the Village's snow removal plan is to have all of the Village-owned streets cleared within eight hours of a four to six-inch snowfall event. More information, including frequently asked questions regarding the Public Works Department's snow removal efforts, can be found on our website at www.lincolnwoodil.org/snow.

The Public Works Department asks all residents to assist the Department in snow removal by parking vehicles

in driveways or garages and refraining from blowing snow into the street. Plowing operations begin when snow accumulates more than two inches, and freezing temperatures indicate that no melting will occur. Parking is always prohibited along Pratt Avenue when two inches or more of snow accumulates.



The Village has an Alternate Side Parking Program to assist with snow removal. When there are two inches of snow or more on even-numbered days of the month, motor vehicles may only be parked on the side of the street with

even-numbered addresses. On odd-numbered days of the month, motor vehicles may only be parked on the side of the street with odd-numbered addresses. Alternate Side Parking is in effect from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday to Friday. When alternate side parking is in effect, a notice is posted on the Village's website www.lincolnwoodil.org.


Face Coverings Required



Container Repair or Upgrade



Lincolnwood Limits




Stay motivated and stretch your limits in this local, virtual challenge! The challenge begins on January 1, but you can join at any time.

Lincolnwood Limits is designed to be a community-based challenge that encourages participants to commit to running, walking, biking, or otherwise completing the equivalent of the distance of Lincolnwood's boundaries (7.7 miles) a certain times each month. This is a distance-based challenge, which provides an opportunity to vary your pace and means of completing the challenge.

You get to "choose your own challenge" within this event in that you are able to determine how many times to complete the equivalent of Lincolnwood's limits each month. This virtual event will begin in January 2021 and run through March 2021 to help us stay motivated during our region's coldest months. You will receive a race shirt and medal and will have the opportunity to earn custom, Lincolnwood-themed pins to add to your medal's lanyard each month. Let's kick this new year off right while inspiring ourselves, neighbors, family, and friends to meet our goals and safety stretch our limits.

How the Challenge Works:

1. When registering for the event, select the number of times, you would like to commit to completing the equivalent of Lincolnwood's limits, or 7.7 miles, each month. Beginning the first week of January, start tracking your daily/weekly miles with your monthly goal in mind.
2. Near the end of each month, our team will check in with you to learn about your progress.
3. For each month that you accomplish your goal, you will



earn a custom, Lincolnwood-focused pin.

4. Celebrate your monthly accomplishments with family, friends, and neighbors! Rock the medal and pins you earned through this unique community challenge!

Important note: This is a virtual challenge; there is no official route or course for this event. Racers are not encouraged to attempt to run the actual Village boundaries. Runners, walkers, and bicyclists determine how to complete the 5K or 10K on their own, at a location of their own choosing at their own risk. The services typically available during an in-person race are not available for the virtual event.

Public Works Reminders

Frozen Water Pipes and Meters

With the upcoming extreme cold, the Village would like to remind residents to prepare water lines for freezing temperatures. Here are a few simple tips to protect your water line:

- Maintain proper heat in your home, at least 55 degrees at all times.
- Make sure there is warm air circulating in uninsulated areas of your home where there are water pipes, including garages and unfinished basements and crawlspaces.
- Disconnect garden hoses from all outdoor faucets. This allows water to drain from frost free faucets.
- Leave a trickle of water running from a faucet to keep water moving through the line.
- If your water meter is located in a furnished area of your basement, check to be sure that the meter has been insulated properly and has protection from freezing during winter months.

If you turn on a faucet and only a trickle comes out, you may have a frozen pipe. If a pipe is broken, turn off the water at the main shutoff valve. If the pipe is undamaged, warm the pipe using a hair dryer or heating pad; do not use candles or open flames. When in doubt, it is always best to contact a licensed plumber to prevent unintended damage.

If you plan to leave for an extended period of time, the Village is available to turn your water off at the b-box to help prevent freezing pipes. Contact the Finance

Department at (847) 673-1540 if you suspect your meter to be frozen or would like to schedule a water shutoff.

Free Holiday Light Recycling Program Reminder

As you take down your holiday lights for the season consider recycling lights that are no longer useful. The Village is offering a free holiday light recycling program in conjunction with the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County and Elgin Recycling, Inc. Accepted items include: Mini-lights (or Italian lights), C7 lights, C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, extension cords, etc. Lights may be dropped off at the Public Works Department located at 7001 N. Lawndale Ave. Monday-Friday between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. The program will end on January 31, 2021. For questions regarding this program please contact the Village of Lincolnwood's

Holiday Tree Clean-Up

Groot will collect holiday trees on Monday, January 4, and Monday, January 11, 2021. Trees must have all decorations removed and be placed curbside for pick-up. There is no additional cost for this service. Trees larger than six feet must be cut in half.

Fire Hydrant Accessibility

In cases of emergency, seconds count, this winter help out by adopting a fire hydrant. Adopting a fire hydrant near your home includes clearing the snow between the street and the hydrant following a storm. When you adopt a fire hydrant, you ensure it is accessible to the Fire Department in times of emergency.



Village Staff Update



Scott Mangum

The Village of Lincolnwood is pleased to announce the hiring of its new Director of Community Development, Scott Mangum. The announcement comes after the retirement of former Community Development Director Steve McNellis on November 11, 2020.

Mr. Mangum has worked in the municipal planning field for nearly two decades, with his most recent position as the City of Evanston’s Planning and Zoning Manager. In addition to Evanston, Mr. Mangum has served the Cities of Chicago, Des Plaines, and Long Beach, California. His project experience includes the coordination of the Albion Evanston development, a 15 story luxury apartment building, and serving as the project manager for the McDonald’s Corporation Headquarters building in Chicago’s West Loop.

During his tenure as a Planner in Long Beach, California, Scott worked closely with the community and attended 500 community meetings.

Mr. Mangum received his Masters of Planning degree from the University of Southern California, concentrating his coursework in the areas of social and environmental planning and community and economic development. He also has a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Mr. Mangum has continued his professional development by achieving the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP) certification, which is a nationwide recognition.

The hiring of Scott Mangum comes after a nationwide search was conducted, which yielded 74 applicants for the position. Mr. Mangum began working with the Village on December 2, 2020.

Development Updates

Lincolnwood Porsche, 7101 North Lincoln Avenue

The Loeber Porsche dealership at 7101 North Lincoln Avenue has completed its redevelopment. The facility, now known as Lincolnwood Porsche, includes a state-of-the-art showroom, enhanced landscaping and site circulation, and a new indoor inventory facility that used to be a vacant light industrial building. A ribbon-cutting was held at the dealership on December 4, 2020.

Zeigler Cadillac

Construction of the new Zeigler Cadillac dealership at 7373 North Cicero Avenue is progressing. The dealership, which replaces a vacant light industrial building, will add a modern look to the Cicero Avenue corridor and will include a modern showroom, service area, and inventory lot. The property, which encompasses approximately four acres, will include enhanced stormwater management, landscaping, and signage.

6699 Lincoln Avenue

The former Schmaus Cash Register Company building at 6699 North Lincoln Avenue is undergoing renovation to transform it into a commercial structure of approximately 4,500 square feet. The project includes a complete renovation of the building's interior, façade improvement, and new landscaping and planting islands.
