**Subject:** Pedestrian Traffic Crash Leads to Criminal Charges

On Friday, July 27, 2018 at approximately 6:34 p.m., the Lincolnwood Police Department responded to a traffic crash investigation in the 3600 block of Touhy Avenue. Officers learned that a single motorcycle had struck an adult male pedestrian and an accompanying three year old female pedestrian crossing mid-block in the eastbound traffic lanes.

Lincolnwood Fire Department and Skokie Fire Department paramedics transported the motorcycle driver and adult pedestrian victim to Evanston Hospital in good condition. The three old female victim was transported initially to St. Francis Hospital in critical condition and later transferred to Lutheran General Hospital in Park Ridge where the victim remains in the intensive care unit.

As a result of this incident, police on scene requested a multi-jurisdictional response to assist with traffic control and the North Regional Major Crimes Major Crash Assistance Team due to the severity of injuries to the three year old pedestrian.

The police investigation indicated that the motorcycle driver, Glen E. Granskog, age 45 of Orlando, Florida had a blood alcohol level above the legal limit. Subsequently, a charge of Aggravated Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol was approved by the felony review unit of the Cook County State's Attorney's Office. Additional related traffic charges are listed below in this media release.

A preliminary hearing court date will be set by the Circuit Court of Cook County – Skokie 2<sup>nd</sup> Municipal District and an arrest photo of the defendant is attached to this media release.
